

UD Scholarships & Grants—Newark

- Aid that does not need to be repaid
- Offered during the admission process
- Scholarships will be available in mid-March
- No separate application required; all first-time, fall admitted students are reviewed for these based upon materials and information supplied with the admission application.
- Grants consideration requires the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Other Types of Aid

Federal Grants*

Based on financial need

Federal Student Loans*

May or may not be based on financial need; does not require credit check; level of subsidy based on financial need; *must be repaid*

Federal Work Study*

Employment funding offered based on financial need; does not need to be repaid but student must work to earn funds as wages

Federal PLUS Loans*

Offered in the parent's name; not based on financial need; requires credit check; must be repaid

Alternative Loans

Offered in student's name; not based on financial need; requires credit check; must be repaid

*Requires submission of the FAFSA

2024-2025 FAFSA

Due to the FAFSA Simplification process, schools are delayed in receiving aid eligibility information from the 2024-2025 FAFSA. This means full aid packages which require filing the FAFSA will not be available until mid-April. If you have not already, we recommend you file your FAFSA now to ensure you receive your aid package as soon as possible.

First State Promise—Newark

Along with lower tuition rates than non-resident students, Delaware residents with family incomes and assets under a certain amount (as reflected on the FAFSA) will have tuition covered with grants and scholarships under limited exceptions.

SEED Scholarship—Associate in Arts

The SEED Scholarship program covers tuition for full-time students enrolled in the Associate in Arts Program (AAP). Students must be Delaware residents who graduate from a Delaware high school with a 2.5 or higher GPA, enroll in AAP for their first college semester, and have not been convicted of a felony. These funds may be replaced by the Federal Pell Grant for qualified students. The FAFSA is required to be considered.
