



WE AND SYSTEM MAINTENANCE

ife of your basketball system depends on many variables. The climate, exposure to corrosives such as salt, pesticides or herbicides d excessive use or misuse can all contribute to pole failure which may cause property damage or personal injury. Check your basketball system frequently for loose hardware, excessive wear and signs of corrosion. For safety reasons, and to

prolong the life of your basketball system, you must take the following preventative measures:

- a. Check all nuts and bolts. If any are loose, tighten them.
- b. Check all parts for excessive wear and tear. If necessary replace any parts that have been worn or damaged through usage. Check the pole plug to be sure that there are no cracks or teas that could let water into the pole sections.
- c. Check all pole sections for visible rust or chipped or cracked paint. If either are present do the following:
 - 1. Remove any rust or chipped paint completely using emery chair.
 - 2. Clean the area with a damp cloth and allow to dry.
 - 3. Apply two coats of a rust preventative, high gloss enamel paint to the area. Allow the paint to dry between coats. IF RUST HAS PENETRATED THROUGH THE POLE ANYWHERE REPLACE IT IMMEDIATELY!

TRANSPORTING THE PORTABLE BASE

- 1. Adjust the basketball system to its lowest position.
- 2. Face the system and pull back on the pole until unit is balanced on its wheels.
- 3. Move the portable system and carefully set the base down.
- 4. Check the base for stability before play.


CAUTION WATCH FOR **PINCH POINTS**



ALWAYS KEEP HANDS CLEAR OF ADJUSTMENT MECHANISM!

TO RAISE: Place the end of a long object, such as a broom handle, under the goal and push up. (SEE ILLUSTRATION)

TO LOWER: Place the broom handle behind the backboard and push upward into the release box. Carefully support the weight as you lower the system. (SEE ILLUSTRA-TION)

- Always keep hands and fingers away from moving parts (adjustment mechanism, etc.). DO NOT attempt to adjust unit without a broom handle as specified in the instructions. Make sure locking knob is securely tightened before play.
- DO NOT perform dunk-type activities on this unit. The portable bases are not designed for this type of extreme use.
- Always check the portable base for stability before play. Surface beneath the base must be smooth and free of gravel or other sharp objects. Punctures cause leakage and could cause unit to tip over. Use extreme caution if water is used in the base. If a leak develops, water could run out unnoticed allowing the unit to fall over and resulting in the injuries listed above or property damage. Check base frequently for leaks.
- Players must wear a mouth guard while playing close to the net. During play, use extreme caution to keep face and mouth away from the rim and net. Serious dental injury can occur if a player's teeth/face come in contact with the rim or net.
- Fill base completely with sand or water. Never operate or leave the unit standing in an upright position without first filling the base with weight or it may tip over and cause injuries such as those fisted above.
- DO NOT use the unit during windy and/or severe weather conditions or the unit may tip over. Place system in storage position and/or in an area protected from the wind and free of personal property and/or overhead power lines.
- · Check pole system twice a year for signs of corrosion (rust, pitting, chipping) and repaint with exterior enamel paint. If rust has penetrated through the pole or any component, replace parts immediately.
- · Inspect unit before each use for loose hardware, excessive wear and signs of corrosion and repair before use.
- DO NOT wear jewelry (rings, watches, necklaces, etc.) while using the basketball system. Serious personal injury may occur if jewelry is caught on the rim or net.
- Keep organic material away from pole base. Grass, litter, etc. could cause corrosion
