Students in POSC 380/ LEST 380 (Introduction to Law): Section 12 (2:00 pm)

Welcome back to the University of Delaware campus for the Spring 2019 semester. Here is some information about the course before the first class meets on Tuesday, February 12.

First, POSC 380 and LEST 380 are the same class and meet together. There are two sections of the class. Both sections meet in Room 219 in Gore Hall on Tuesdays and Thursdays. Section 12 meets at 2:00 pm; Section 13 meets at 3:30 pm.

Second, the textbook for the class is Henry R. Cheeseman, *Business Law: Legal Environment, Online Commerce, etc.* (Prentice Hall, 9th edition). There are new and used copies of the hardback edition available in the bookstore. There also are loose-leaf and electronic editions available, which may be less expensive and more convenient. In any event, do *not* buy an older edition as the material (and pagination) is different, and do not buy the new 10th edition, which is more expensive. There is an optional study guide that *may* be useful to some students, but I do not particularly recommend it.
