TEACHING EXPERIENCE

I have been teaching at the University of Delaware consistently since the Spring of 2010 with primary teaching responsibilities in the Leadership program; I have also taught courses for the MPA and undergraduate Policy programs as well as the English Language Institute at the University of Delaware. From 2013 - 2017, I was also an adjunct professor at Millersville University of Pennsylvania in the undergraduate Sociology and Anthropology Department and in the Emergency Management Graduate Program.

The information contained herein captures an abbreviated, 2-year timeframe, January 1, 2021 - December 31, 2022 in alignment with the current peer review cycle.

University of Delaware, Newark, DE February 2010 to Present Assistant Professor, Biden School of Public Policy and Administration

The courses listed below are typically offered to 30-40 students per semester and follow the curriculum standards designed in collaboration with other full-time leadership faculty members. The development of course syllabi and associated materials, lecture/classroom activities, homework assignments, discussion boards and Canvas course design are independently completed each semester. I typically revise my course syllabus each semester and at a minimum ensure updates are incorporated annually in alignment with research developments in the leadership and related fields as well as student feedback which I collect two times each semester.

- **LEAD 101 Global Contexts for Leadership**, an undergraduate course, offered online during special (i.e. select Summer and Winter) sessions, covering topics such as: language and communication, cultural conditioning and categorization, use of time, motivate, and trust among and within organizations around the world.
- **LEAD 200 The Leadership Challenge**, an undergraduate course, offered in multiple sections and formats, during special and traditional sessions. The course has become one of the most popular courses among undergraduates in the leadership

- program and covers topics such as: understanding theory its utility and limitations, behavioral approaches to leadership, transformation leadership, path-goal theory, leader-member exchange theory, gender, culture, ethics and project management.
- LEAD 300 Leadership, Creativity, and Innovation, an undergraduate course, offered in multiple sections and formats, during special and traditional sessions. The course covers topics such as: divergent thinking, mindfulness, domain specific creativity and innovation (e.g. dance, music, drama/theatre, etc.), biomimicry and application to social innovation initiatives.
- **LEAD 341 Decision-Making and Leadership,** an undergraduate course, offered during traditional sessions (i.e. Fall and Spring semesters) covers topics such as: ethics in decision-making, traps in decision-making, case study analysis, multi-attribute utility theory (MAUT), and distinguishing influence from advocacy.
- LEAD 390 Undergraduate Teaching Assistantship in Leadership, an undergraduate course offered only to top-preforming students in previous semesters with demonstrated interest in academic teaching.

- **LEAD 400 Leadership for the Common Good,** an undergraduate course, offered in the Fall of each academic year covers topics such as: social change model of leadership development, consciousness of self, civil discourse, and policy entrepreneurship.
- UAPP 330 Public and Nonprofit Administration, an undergraduate course in the Public Policy program, covers topics such as: modern public service, management principles, organization theory, performance measurement, ethics and transparency in public service.
- **Doctoral Student Teaching Assistants,** I am fortunate to have had support via PhD level graduate students from the DISA program throughout much of my time at the University of Delaware. Though responsibilities vary depending upon TA availability and experience, I believe each of my TAs have gained valuable experience regarding teaching in the college classroom.
