General Information

- Daucus carota var. sativus, Carrot
- Umbelliferae family
- Sunlight: full sun. Will tolerate very light shade.
- Soil conditions: Good quality roots require
 plentiful moisture well-drained soil, that is
 deep, loose, free of stones and high in organic
 matter.

Successful Cultivators

- Danvers Half Long (75 days) 8" long, bright orange, sweet and tender.
- Scarlet Nantes (70 days) 7" long, smooth skin, deep orange-red color.
- Yellowstone (73 days) 6-8" long, deep color, strong tops.

Common Pests and Diseases

- Carrot rust fly
- Carrot weevil (pictured here)
- Leafhopper
- Blight
