## **General Information**

- Solanum lycopersicum, Tomato
- Solanaceae family
- Sunlight: full sun.
- Soil conditions: well-drained, fertile soil, high in organic matter.
- Tomatoes come in both determinate (bush) varieties and indeterminate (climbing) varieties.

## Successful Cultivators

- Sun Gold (57 days) Exceptionally sweet, bright orange cherry. Indeterminate.
- Early Cherry (55 days) 1" tomatoes, robust, full flavor. Determinate.
- Gardener's Delight (65 days) Clusters of 6-12 cherry tomatoes, crack resistant. Indeterminate.

## Common Pests and Diseases

- Early Blight
- Late Blight
- Blossom End Rot
- Fusarium Wilt
- Tomato Hornworm
- Stink Bug
