General Information

- Scientific Name: Lactuca sativa
- Family: Asteraceae
- Cool season
- Planting Window:
 - o Spring: mid-March to late April
- Fall: early August to mid-September
- **pH** = 6.0-7.0
- Planting Depth: 1/8-1/4 inch, direct sow in soil
- **MPD:** 5 inches (in both directions)
- Easy to grow from seed!

Successful Cultivators

- Cultivars:
 - o Black Seeded Simpson (45 days)
 - o Red Salad Bowl (50 days)
 - o Buttercrunch (65 days)
 - o Little Gem (45 days) compact Romaine type
 - o Parris Island Romaine (55 days)
 - o Giant Caesar Romaine (70 days)
- Harvest any time up to maturity (mature at 8-12 in.)
 - o Cut two inches above soil, recut repeatedly
 - o You can eat the thinnings!

Common Pests and Diseases

- Slugs (beer saloon, diatomaceaous earth)
- Rabbits removable rabbit wire cages
- Cutworms toothpicks around trunk
