### What is Linguistics?

Linguistics is the scientific study of human language. Language is one of the most complex cognitive tasks that humans engage in, yet it is used effortlessly and subconsciously and is acquired by infants with no formal instruction. Language can be studied from many different angles: its formal properties comprise the core areas of phonology, morphology, syntax, and semantics; psycholinguistics is the study of the psychology of language (how it is represented in the mind/brain and how it is used in real time); language acquisition studies how infants acquire language; sociolinguistics studies language as a social construct; language typology investigates how languages differ and how they are the same. Applied areas of linguistics seek to improve methods of teaching second languages, or to improve the treatment of language disorders.

#### The Linguistics Curriculum

Students must earn a C- or higher in all courses within the major.
