BASIC HTML tags

Starting	Ending	
<html>	</html>	Always at the very beginning and at the end of your web page
<head>	</head>	Placed after the <html> tag (General info about page)
<title>	</title>	Placed between the head tags
<body>	</body>	Placed after the </head> tag and before the final </html> tag. Contains the information that appears on your web page
<h#>	</h#>	Heading Tags - Displays text in Bold with various font sizes in a new paragraph (" # = 1 thru 6 [1 is largest] ")
<p>	</p>	Paragraph tags Options: <p align="left">, <p align="center">, <p align="right">
 		Inserts a line break
		Bold
<u>	</u>	Underline
<i>	</i>	Italic
<strike>	</strike>	Strikeout text
_		Subscript text
[]	Superscript text
		 (# = 1 thru 7 [7 is largest])
