

FRAMESET Tag

<FRAMESET> </FRAMESET>

Use: The Frameset element defines how many columns and/or rows there will be in the frameset. Each Frame element holds a separate document.

Options: ROWS = "value, value" or COLS = "value, value" [Value may be Pixels , % or *]

FRAME TAG

<FRAME src = filename">

Options: NAME = "name" [Labels a frame for targeting by other frames]
NORESIZE = "noresize"
SCROLLING = "yes" or "no"

NOFRAME TAG

<NOFRAMES> </NOFRAMES>

Provides alternate content for browsers that do not support frames

Example:
