

IFRAME Tag

<IFRAME> </IFRAME>

Use: The IFRAME tag defines an inline frame within a document that is used for embedding an HTML document on a web page. Each IFRAME element holds a separate document.

Options:

- border="0|1" turns on or off the display of a border for the frame. The default is 1, which displays a border.
- height="p" or "x%" (pixels or percent of window size)
- width="p" or "x%" (pixels or percent of window size)
- marginheight="p" specifies the amount of space (in pixels) between the top and bottom edges of the inline frame and its contents.
- marginwidth="p" specifies the amount of space (in pixels) between the left and right edges of the inline frame and its contents.
- name = "text" assigns a name to the inline frame to be referenced by targeted links.
- scrolling="yes|no|auto" specifies whether scroll bars appear in the frame. A value of "auto" (the default) means scroll bars appear automatically whenever the contents do not fit within the frame.
- src = "URL" specifies the URL of the HTML document to display initially within the inline frame.
